SERVICES

- **Behavior Specialist** Services focus on working with administration, teachers, paraprofessionals, psychologists, students and families to develop positive social emotional behavioral skills.
- **Cen7ter** Cen7ter is designed to meet the needs of students ages 14 to 21 with developmental disabilities. Cen7ter's mission is to empower students to use their strengths to assist in preparing each individual to gain employment and independent living skills. The Cen7ter program places emphasis on life skills, academics, social skills, independent living, recreation/leisure, and prevocational opportunities. Cen7ter services are IEP driven and available 1 5 days a week.
- **Deaf Education** A teacher of the Hearing Impaired provides deaf education services and/or consultation for students verified as deaf or hard of hearing. Deaf Educators work with an audiologist to ensure appropriate aural rehabilitation services.
- **Distance Learning** ESU 7 coordinates courses for K-12 grade students and professional development for educators using an alternative method of delivery.
- Early Childhood Intervention includes a variety of programs available for children 0-5 years of age including evaluation, intervention and program planning for children experiencing learning difficulties and/or developmental delays.
- Grant Facilitation ESU 7 facilitates state and federal grants including: Title IA, Migrant Education (Title IC), Title IIA, Title III, Title IV, Carl Perkins, Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD), Early Learning Connection (ELC), Planning Region Team (PRT), Transition, Regional 4 Behavioral Health System Prevention, and PEaK (Promoting Engagement and Knowledge).
- Instructional Resources ESU 7 provides instructional materials through a regional center to support curriculum standards and instruction including information literacy and skill development.



SERVICES

- Learning Academy The ESU 7 Learning Academy supports students aged 5 - 21 in unlocking their potential by working collaboratively with stakeholders; and meeting students where they are academically, behaviorally, and socially to build on their strengths in order to successfully transition back to their prior educational environment.
- Mental Health To find the best solution for each student and situation and use different counseling strategies to address student's needs socially and emotionally. To collaborate with educators, parents and other professionals to create safe, healthy, and supportive learning environments for all students that strengthen connections between home and school. Counsel with an emphasis on prevention. Work with individuals and their families to promote optimum mental health of the student.
- **Production** ESU 7 offers efficient and cost-effective production and art media services including copying, collating, stapling, laminating, binding, folding, letters and symbols, and full color poster printing.
- **Professional Development** ESU 7 provides professional development support and technical assistance related to curriculum, instruction, assessment, standards and school improvement to enhance learning, teaching and school/district planning.
- **Program Supervision** ESU 7's Special Education Department offers leadership and service in collaboration with our school districts in several areas.
- **Psychology** ESU 7 provides comprehensive school psychological services to students, schools and families, helping students succeed in academic achievement, social skills acquisition, behavior functioning and positive social-emotional development.
- **Resource Coach** Works with teachers and other district staff to provide guidance, training, resources and strategies for working with students while utilizing programs and materials.






- Speech and Language Speech Language Pathologists (SLPs) address evaluation, consultation and intervention for children experiencing speech/language difficulties. SLPs also provide support for children with articulation disorders, voice problems and dysfluency.
- Special Education ESU 7 provides contracted Special Education services to districts including: Psychology, Speech and Language, Vision, Hearing, Early Childhood, Resource Coach, Behavior Specialist and Program Supervision.
- **Technology** ESU 7 provides technology support, consultation, assistance, training and skill development for hardware and software in addition to cost-savings for internet services and software purchases.
- **Vision** Provides resources, services and supports in collaboration with schools, families and community agencies to children who have a visual impairment.



This visual represents how the ESU services accessed align with AQuESTT Tenets. (see more real-time data about the AQuESTT implementation)


