This annual report serves the following purposes:

- To meet legal requirements set forth by §79-1228
- To provide information about ESU 7 activities to member schools, and
- To provide data by which decision can be made.

The Educational Service Unit 7 provides leadership and services supporting the teaching and learning to school districts in the counties of Boone, Butler, Colfax, Merrick, Nance, Platte, and Polk and includes 19 public school districts, 13,000 students, approximately 1200 teachers and 80 administrators and 95 ESU 7 employees. We are here to support our schools in their charge of educating the students of today, who will be our leaders, educators, front line workers, and citizens of our communities in the years to come. This work is not taken lightly, nor without planning.

Each year, we use data from our schools in determining how best to serve them. These data inform our service plan for the ESU 7 region, and is the basis for our customized service planning to each member school district. Delivering high quality supplemental services to our schools, leaders, teachers, and students is of high importance to us.

ESU 7 provides support to our school districts through core services set forth in state statute which includes professional development, instructional materials, and technology/infrastructure. Additionally, we provide special education contracts as well as on-site technology personnel. The Migrant Education Program, Early Learning Connection, and Autism Spectrum Disorders grants are facilitated by ESU 7 and provides support to many ESUs, their schools, students and families.

Nebraska Department of Education's Rule 84 establishes performance expectations for ESU accreditation by which ESU 7 continues to meet. Member school districts rely on ESU 7 for its expertise in special education, professional development, technology and infrastructure support, production, and grant facilitation.

SERVICES

- Distance Learning ESU 7 coordinates courses for K-12 grade students and professional development for educators using an alternative method of delivery.
- Grant Facilitation ESU 7 facilitates state and federal grants including: Title IA, Migrant Education (Title IC), Title IIA, Title III, Title IV, Carl Perkins, Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD), Early Learning Connection (ELC), Planning Region Team (PRT), Transition, Regional Transition, and PEaK (Promoting Engagement and Knowledge).
- Instructional Resources ESU 7 provides instructional materials through a regional center to support curriculum standards and instruction including information literacy and skill development.
- LANMAN Partnership ESU 7 offers to supply technical services on a
 consistent scheduled basis per our LANMAN Partnership service agreement.
 A District Technology Coordinator is hired by the ESU and assigned to those
 schools who choose to participate in the service.
- Mental Health Mental health provides work to find the best solution for each student and situation and use different counseling strategies to address student's needs socially and emotionally. They collaborate with educators, parents and other professionals to create safe, healthy, and supportive learning environments for all students that strengthen connections between home and school. They counsel students with an emphasis on prevention and work with individuals and their families to promote optimum mental health of the student.
- Production/Print Shop ESU 7 offers efficient and cost-effective production and art media services including copying, collating, stapling, laminating, binding, folding, letters and symbols, and full color poster printing.
- Professional Development ESU 7 provides professional development support and technical assistance related to curriculum, instruction, assessment, standards and school improvement to enhance learning, teaching and school/district planning.



• Special Education

- **Behavior Specialist** Services focus on working with administration, teachers, paraprofessionals, psychologists, students and families to develop positive social emotional behavioral skills.
- Cen7ter Cen7ter is designed to meet the needs of students ages 14 to 21 with developmental disabilities. Cen7ter's mission is to empower students to use their strengths to assist in preparing each individual to gain employment and independent living skills. The Cen7ter program places emphasis on life skills, academics, social skills, independent living, recreation/leisure, and prevocational opportunities. Cen7ter services are IEP driven and available 1 5 days a week.
- Deaf Education A teacher of the Hearing Impaired provides deaf education services and/or consultation for students verified as deaf or hard of hearing. Deaf Educators work with an audiologist to ensure appropriate aural rehabilitation services.
- Early Childhood Intervention includes a variety of programs available for children 0-5 years of age including evaluation, intervention and program planning for children experiencing learning difficulties and/or developmental delays.
- Learning Academy The ESU 7 Learning Academy supports students aged 5 - 21 in unlocking their potential by working collaboratively with stakeholders; and meeting students where they are academically, behaviorally, and socially to build on their strengths in order to successfully transition back to their prior educational environment.




- Special Education Continued...
 - Program Supervision ESU 7's Special Education department provides leadership and support in collaboration with our member schools in several areas. The ESU 7 Special Education Director, administrative assistant, and bookkeeper provide Special Education finance services such as SPEDFRS and IDEA as well as the bookkeeper network to support district bookkeepers. The Special Education Director serves as a liaison between NDE and districts. Compliance and best practice support are provided along with IEP facilitation. Resource teachers are supported with NDE guidance, training, and TIP support. Professional Development is offered to districts on a variety of topics for teachers and paraeducators.
 - Psychology ESU 7 provides comprehensive school psychological services to students, schools and families, helping students succeed in academic achievement, social skills acquisition, behavior functioning and positive social-emotional development.
 - **Resource Coach** Works with teachers and other district staff to provide guidance, training, resources and strategies for working with students while utilizing programs and materials.
 - Speech and Language Speech Language Pathologists (SLPs) address evaluation, consultation and intervention for children experiencing speech/language difficulties. SLPs also provide support for children with articulation disorders, voice problems and dysfluency.
 - Vision Provides resources, services and supports in collaboration with schools, families and community agencies to children who have a visual impairment.
- **Technology** ESU 7 provides technology support, consultation, assistance, training and skill development for hardware and software in addition to cost-savings for internet services and software purchases.






